

What's new with RAFR?

RAFR is a group of concerned citizens formed to oppose Frankford Hospital's proposal to build hospital and two other buildings at the intersection of Route 332 and Stony Hill Road, on the corner next to the Shady Brook Farm. We oppose the SPECIAL EXCEPTION that Frankford Hospital is seeking from the Lower Makefield Township's (LMT) Zoning Hearing Board to build the new hospital.

What have we been up to lately?

- **Signs**—You have probably noticed the red STOP signs all around the Township. These have been helpful to get the word out about the issues.
- **Petitions**—We have gathered the names of over 1,000 LMT residents who are opposed to the move.
- **Legal Help**—We have hired an attorney to represent RAFR at Zoning Board hearings.
- **Letters to the editor**—We have had several letters to the editor in the local papers.
- **Guest Opinions**—We have had two lengthy Guest Opinions against the move in the BCCT.
- **LMT Meetings**—We have been speaking out at LMT Zoning Board and Supervisor's Meetings.
- **Fundraising**—We have had mass mailings to raise funds to oppose the move.

RAFR Fundraising Drive—THANK YOU!!

Thanks to the many, many LMT residents who responded to our recent fundraising drive which was very successful. This money is used to let LMT residents know about the Frankford Hospital issue, for signs, mailings, and for legal assistance in this effort.

Where do the Supervisors stand?

The LMT Board of Supervisors are **UNANIMOUSLY AGAINST** the hospital relocation because of increased traffic and increased taxes it will bring to LMT residents.

NOTE: Frankford Hospital has changed their name to ARIA Health. Only the name has changed—the issues remain the same.



What's going on with the Zoning Board Meetings?

- **8 Zoning Board Meetings** since August to discuss the hospital move.
- **74 LETTERS** received by the Zoning Board plus several resolutions from homeowners associations opposing the move!
- **TRAFFIC STUDY** presented at the **March 17 Zoning Board Meeting** showed that congestion was much worse than described in the Frankford Hospital proposal. Even without the hospital, this is considered a very overcrowded intersection. At the April 7th Zoning Board Meeting, the attorney for the hospital tried to discredit the LMT traffic study.

What's happening now?

- **SPREAD THE WORD** We continue to talk to as many people as we can to inform as many LMT residents as possible and to increase our support in the community.
- **FUNDRAISING** We are continuing to raise funds to pay legal fees.

What's next?

- **NEXT ZONING BOARD** public meeting to hear hospital comments is scheduled for **Tuesday, June 2nd** and **Tuesday, June 16th at 7PM.**
